10:00 – 10:30 **[Stop 1]** Visit to Sue No Matsuyama: Historical site of the 869 Jogan tsunami
10:30 – 10:45 Move to Sendai Port
10:45 – 11:30 **[Stop 2]** Visit to the tsunami evacuation tower with Sendai City officers
11:30 – 12:20 Lunch
12:20 – 12:45 Move to former Arahama Elementary School, Sendai City, Namiwake Shrine (story of the 1611 tsunami) and the express that served as evacuation area during the tsunami
12:45 – 13:15 **[Stop 3]** Visit to Arahama Elementary School, evacuation shelter used during the tsunami
13:15 – 13:20 Move to Arahama beach, Natori City
13:20 – 13:50 **[Stop 4]** Visit to new seawall and damaged pine forest/residential area in Arahama beach
13:50 – 14:00 Move to Yuriage village, Natori City, viewing of elevated road
14:00 – 14:30 **[Stop 5]** Visit reconstruction site (elevated land), historical monument in Yuriage village
14:30 – 14:45 Move to Millennium Hope Hills, Iwanuma City and Sendai Airport
14:45 – 16:00 **[Stop 6]** Visit the hills built with tsunami debris and Sendai Airport
16:00 – 17:00 Return to Sendai Station
